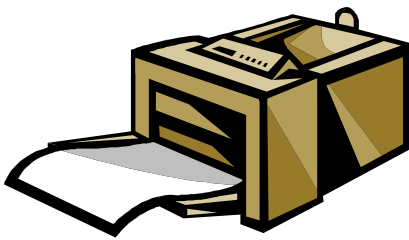

ages from which you can choose and import into your newsletter. There are also several tools you can use to draw shapes and symbols.

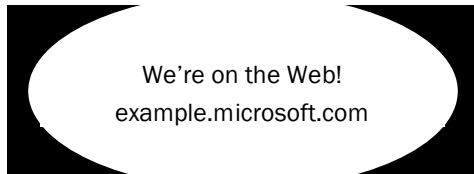
Once you have chosen an image, place it close to the article. Be sure to place the caption of the image near the image.

You can also use this space to remind readers to mark their calendars for a regular event, such as a breakfast meeting for vendors every third Tuesday of the month, or a biannual charity auction.
